

**FOOD FOR THOUGHT
GOD'S WILL FOR THE LOST.**

Beloved, the whole of Luke Chapter 15 which was partly read as one of our readings today focuses on the lost. In that Chapter of the Bible, Jesus told us three parables and they all focus on "the lost" and the will of God concerning them.

For the purpose of our Food for Thought this Week, we shall focus on the Parable of the prodigal son taking a clue from James 5:19-20 ***"My brethren, if any among you err from the truth, and one convert him; let him know that he who converts a sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death, and shall cover a multitude of sins"***

In Luke 15:11-31 We are introduced to a young man who desired to be independent from his father and asked for his inheritance while the father was still alive. His attitude represents the modern society and the backslidden Christian who believe they don't need God.

This foolish young man was certain he will be better off on his own. Hence after collecting his inheritance, he went to a distant country away from his home. There he squandered his wealth in flamboyant living. His enjoyment lasted only for a season because soon he lost everything. There was a severe famine in that land that made the situation worse. Shortly after he found himself with the demeaning job of feeding the Swine (unclean animals for the Jews). No one gave him anything even though he starved because he had fallen so low and become very insignificant

He returned to his father because he realized the error of his ways after working for the foreigner for some time. This stage of his life reminds us of the backslidden people who decide to turn from their wicked ways and return to God. Why do Christians backslide? Is a question we must provide answer to before considering the will of God for the lost.

People backslide because they think it's better for them to be independent of God. Luke 15:11-12, Isaiah 53:6). People backslide for worldly pleasures leaving them to be spiritually empty. Luke 15:13-14, Jeremiah 2:13. Some also backslide to satisfy themselves for one thing or the other. Luke 15:15-16, Revelation 3:17. The consequences of getting lost includes but not limited to being separated from the love of God and fellowship with Him.

The father's reactions to the returning of the prodigal son reveal God's will for the lost. Our God has compassion for the lost. (Matthew 9:36); God forgives the sinners that comes to Him of their sins and clothe them with His righteousness. (Isaiah 61:10); God treats the lost who return to Him as His sons rather than His servants. (1 John 3:1); God removes the guilt of sin from sinners who come to Him and assure them of everlasting freedom. (John 8:32); God demonstrates His love towards sinners that come to Him and He will not spare anything to save them, not even his son. (John 3:16); When a lost man or woman repents there's great joy among the angels of heaven. (Luke 15:10).

The parable of the prodigal son shows that God is more than happy to receive the lost sinners with forgiveness, love, compassion, grace and the full rights of children, if they return to Him sincerely. It is not also impossible to have identified someone around you who need to return to the Saviour, it is your responsibility to make every effort to help him or her return. James 5:19-20.

This day, if you admit your need to return to the savior, I encourage you to return and rededicate your life to Jesus and I assure you of God's readiness to have mercy and receive you as His Child.

INTRODUCTION

Humility is the absence of pride. Humility is when we acknowledge our helplessness and need of God. A humble man sees himself as nothing, unqualified and inadequate before God. One who is humble has respect for the word of God. He will not humiliate others or exploit them because of his position. He bends so low to serve in the things considered by others to be far below their class.

DISCUSSION

3. Explain the gains that humility brings to a person. Luke 5:3-4; Matt. 8:8,13.
4. What is the end result of pride? Dan. 4:28-33; Acts 12:21-23

CONCLUSION

Any one that aspires to rise in glory must of necessity humble himself under the hands of God. When humility is lacking, favour will be far away from a man. We must deliberately cultivate the life of humility by allowing the word of God to prevail on us.

Humility exalts a man from glory to glory but pride casts one down from grace to grass.

God will not commit a bigger thing into our charge when we are not faithful with the little he has given us.

INTRODUCTION

4. What is the danger of impatience? 1 Samuel 13:7-14.
5. From your own experience explain how patience has led to a glorious testimony?
6. How can believers develop true patience? Phil. 1:61, Hab. 2:1-3, 2Tim. 4:2, Rom. 15:4-5.

CONCLUSION

Demonstrating or developing patience, a cardinal characteristic of God, in the face of trying events is a clear indication that we are developing genuine godliness. We must learn to turn trials into positive growth opportunities as did Job in the midst of diverse frustrating situations. We must learn to endure patiently with the help of God's Spirit.

To rise in glory, we must company with the right people whose lives will motivate, encourage and challenge us to live well. We must always remember this axiom "You become like the people you spend most of your time with, choose carefully."

INTRODUCTION

DISCUSSION:

5. What are the dangers of not seeking guidance from God? Isaiah 30:1,1:19.

CONCLUSION

It is worth noting that whatever our goals and dreams are, we can do much more with God than without Him.

THEME: PATH TO GLORY

SUB-TOPIC: PATHWAY TO RISING GLORY LIVING BY THE WORD

TEXT: 2Cor.3:18; John 1:1-5; Psalm 119:65; 89; 105; Heb.4:12

INTRODUCTION

Psalm 119 bears substantial testimony of what happens when one lives by the word of God. "You have dealt well with Your servant, O LORD, according to Your word." The strategic phrase ("according to Your word") has two implications: living in line with God's word and living by the provisions of God's word. Therefore, those who live according to God's word not only find their direction in the Scriptures; they find resources there as well. This study therefore is aimed at showing how living in God's word could result in one's glory rising from one level to another.

DISCUSSION

1. What do you understand by living by the word? Psa. 119:11, 65; Luke 4:4,5:4-5.
2. What relationship exists between living in Christ and living in God's word? John 1:1-5,15:7
3. Identify four functions of living by God's word. Heb. 4:12; John 5:39; 2Tim. 3:15; 1 Pet. 1:23; 1 Pet. 2:2-3
4. Why do we need to live by God's word? Prov. 30:5-6; Rev. 22:18-19; 2Tim. 3:16-17; Isaiah 55:11
5. How can living by God's word bring about rising in glory of a believer? Isa. 55:11; 2Cor. 3:18; Psa. 119:89; Luke 5:4-7; John 15:5.

CONCLUSION.

Jesus Christ is the true word of God that was made flesh, and when we allow this word to dwell in us, whatever we ask in His name, the Father will grant it unto us including moving us through levels of glory. Hence, it is expedient of us to use this Lenten period to seek Him the more and make a decision to live by God's word all the days of our lives.
